




Parent Post Box

Language & Communication

We have recently introduced communication and language sessions for ALL our children based on their development level.

Language and communication is key and scaffolds all other areas of development and learning.

These sessions will help to encourage good language and communication skills amongst the children.

Melanie has been taking small groups of children for fun sessions twice a day and this has been proving to be successful. At the end of the Spring term we had been focusing on the letter sounds m, a, d, s, t. We learnt one new sound a day and recapped when necessary.

The children have been thoroughly enjoying their group sessions. We went on a sound hunt, matched objects to their initial sounds, air writing the sounds and finally practising writing sounds onto paper.

Literacy and our Outside Environment


During the Spring term staff have gave the children new opportunities in literacy in our outside (& inside) environments.
