


Black History Month — We have celebrated <u>Garrett Morgan</u> (1877-1963) during Black History Month — he invented the three-position traffic light signal, saving countless lives!

The children were asked where they have seen traffic lights, what the colours represent on the lights – many of the children were confidently able to tell us that red means STOP and green means GO (& a few very clever children were able to tell us that AMBER means get ready)!!
