If for any reason you would not like your child to handle the chicks, please do email the pre-school office.




As the 'egg-citement' builds up for the children and staff to receive our eggs/chicks next week we spent time talking about what the chicks may look like when they break through from their eggs and painted our broken shells with our chicks in.

Caterpillars...today marked the arrival of our caterpillars!! Over the course of the next week (or so!) the children will be able to watch the caterpillars munch their food and turn themselves into a chrysalis before performing their magic and reappearing as painted lady butterflies!

The children and staff look forward to being able to handle and release the butterflies on a sunny day when they are strong enough.



Gardening...The children have been busy planting runner beans, mini cucumbers and chives ready to plant into our veggie patch and herb garden.







As the environment around us changes with the seasons we have been very lucky to see the trees begin to blossom across the village. Please do point them out to your children on your walks to/from preschool... using cotton buds, paint and using their fine motorskills the children created these delicate paintings of the blossom trees around us...





To aid the action rhymes song 'Five Little Speckled Frogs' the children created their own speckled frogs (click on the link above to hear the rhyme).



Ashley and Karen created our **Busy Fingers Activity** last week which was thoroughly enjoyed by the majority of the children and required them to use their concentration skills and helped to develop their hand-eye coordination.







We discussed the difference between a reptile and an amphibian, a frogs life cycle and what they prefer to eat, how they eat and how they see underwater...one suggestion was they wore goggles..



Phonics in the past week...Melanie has been introducing some of the children to segmenting and blending sounds. They had to help find the initial sounds that Fred Frog had hidden to make real words again.

Familiar sounds that the children have learnt from previous weeks were used. These sounds included...m, a, d, s, t, I, n, p, g, o.

Continuing with promoting the importance of communication, language and literacy we have started making **Floor Books**, these books are perfect for engaging children and encouraging them to speak out, memory recall and to see themselves in the story.



Floor Books are large books that contain snap shots of the children's day to day learning. Children find it fascinating seeing themselves at play within our story book idea...
